The Canadian Airgun Grand Prix is pleased to offer the following clinics and courses to be held in conjunction with the 2012 match at the Doubletree International Plaza Hotel in Toronto.

Finals Clinic

A Finals Clinic will be held on Saturday, February 25, in the main range, starting around 5:30 p.m. (time subject to scheduling).

This clinic, which will follow the new format for finals, is a hands-on practical session for intermediate and developmental shooters (junior and senior) and will last approximately 90 minutes. Certified coaches will be available to offer tactical advice. As well, internationally competitive athletes who have shot finals will recall their experience.

Working in and around the discussions, the participants will shoot between two and four series of finals. Targets will be scored, announced and projected on the wall to create a full finals experience. This clinic is limited to 20 athletes total, and they must provide proof of payment at the range when the seminar commences. This event was a big success last year so we expect the spaces to fill up quickly.

Cost of this clinic is \$20 to participate or \$10 to observe. You should check it off at the foot of the entry form.
